Enrique contacted me about a project he has been working on for several years intended to help make a positive difference in the lives of underprivileged people who come from conditions similar to the ones we grew up in.


I graduated from Lincoln Prep High School five years before the drive-by shooting of Willie James Jones. In June of 1994, two days after giving his commencement speech from my Alma Mater, Willie was murdered by a group of neighborhood kids. Willie's death was a giant shock to our San Diego community. He was a dear friend of mine, more like my little brother. Willie was also a close friend of Enrique's.

This common thread between the life of Enrique and I has brought us together to step up and unite to fight a cause we both believe must be won. Something must be done to have a real impact in improving our country's underprivileged living environments. Willie James Jones, valedictorian, future medical doctor, potential Olympian, is proof that we must make change happen as quickly as possible.

I support with all my heart the concept of the Champion By Design Institute and its projects to help people develop into champions in all walks of life.
